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Introduction

Report distribution uses a considerable amount of daily operations time when performed manually. Often, however, the time spent sorting and distributing reports goes unnoticed because this activity occurs before the arrival of the recipients of the reports. It is when the completion of this task fails to meet the deadline that the value of timely report distribution becomes apparent to all.

LXI Report Distribution System (LXIrds) works in a manner very similar to the way a report distribution operator works. The operator scans through the stack of printed reports and, using information that appears somewhere on the report, determines where it should be delivered. As part of this process, stacks of reports are created based on destination and/or recipient. Finally, someone delivers each stack of reports to its recipient.

LXI*rds* provides a method of saving time and resources by automating the report distribution process.

Why You Should Use LXIrds

Many reasons exist for choosing LXIrds for your Report Distribution solution, including its wide array of features and functions, ease of implementation, power, flexibility, and ease of use. For those of you familiar with other LXI products, the choice of LXI Report Distribution System will be easy. LXIrds can increase productivity by automating the report distribution process. The flexibility provided by LXIrds allows you to customize and change your report distribution strategy as required without having to modify existing code. The strategy that you create can be reviewed at any time to help ensure that all your requirements are met.

Ease of implementation is key to using any software. The Report Distribution System uses existing IBM facilities and requires no additional modifications to make it function. Since there is no need to make changes to existing code, LXI*rds* is active and ready to use after the installation procedure has completed.

Flexibility When You Need It

Changes are the forte of any data center and LXIrds is designed to adapt easily and quickly. The report distribution strategy that worked so well yesterday can be updated to meet today's challenges within a few minutes. LXIrds menus and commands provide solutions that can be implemented and maintained in one comprehensive software package.

How This Book Is Organized

This manual is organized to help you set up and use the software as quickly and efficiently as possible. If you are familiar with earlier versions of this product, you should scan the table of contents for new features. The LXI*rds* manual is organized as follows:

LXIrds System Overview

Chapters 2 through 5 outline the LXI*rds* features and functions. These chapters also provide a guide to the menu system used by LXI*rds*. Chapter 5 contains the Quick Start exercises, which illustrate the simplicity of use.

Description of Major Functions

Chapters 6 through 8 detail all LXI*rds* functions including the creation of report definitions, packet definitions and custom configuration options.

Reports

Chapter 9 shows the reports and how to use them in creating report definitions. These reports provide you with the information necessary to ensure that your report definitions are set up correctly.

Command References

Chapter 10 provides a list of all LXI*rds* commands, command parameters and values allowed. For those familiar with commands and wishing to bypass the menus, the LXI*rds* commands provide a fast means of setting up and using the product.

Installation Instructions

Chapter 11 contains the information required to successfully install this product. Information on license keys is also provided.

Troubleshooting Guide

Chapter 12 lists the most commonly asked questions regarding LXIrds functionality. If LXIrds does not function as expected, this appendix can provide you with valuable insight quickly.

Software Support

Chapter 13 provides instructions for accessing Electronic Software Support from the LXI technical support staff. In the event that you need a Program Temporary Fix (PTF) or online support, this chapter walks you step-by-step through the process of getting help.

Conventions Used

The conventions used in this manual are established to help you learn and use the product quickly and easily.

The first time a function is referenced, it displays in **bold** type.

Menus, displays, and command prompts are shown as needed to help explain a function or location of a function.

Default parameters for commands are **bold** and **underlined**.

Command Key Actions

To help minimize the time required to learn LXI Report Distribution, IBM command key standards are followed whenever and wherever possible. The following graph shows some of the commands and their use within this product. The command keys available and their associated functions are shown at the bottom of each menu and display.

Command Key	Function	Description
F1	Help	Displays cursor-sensitive help text.
F3	Exit	Exits the function and returns to the prior function.
F4	Prompt	Prompts the user for command parameters.
F5	Refresh	Updates the displays with current information.
F12	Cancel	Cancels the requested function.

Online Help

LXI*rds* provides online help for most commands, menus, and displays. The help provides additional information on a function or field. To access help, position the cursor on the field or parameter in question and press the **F1** key.

LXI*rds* error messages may also provide additional information on the cause of the error and the corrective action to take. To retrieve additional message help, place the cursor on the message and press the **F1** key. If second level help is available, it is displayed.

Before You Install

Before installing this product, review the item below. Knowing this information from the beginning will simplify using LXI*rds*.

System Defaults

LXIrds command defaults conform to iSeries system defaults, where applicable. Overrides can come from IBM commands as well as LXIrds. In areas where IBM has no matching default, LXIrds uses values that cause the software to use the fewest resources and execute the fastest. If the LXIrds command defaults are changed, it is the users responsibility to maintain the changes during product upgrades.

Chapter 2

Features and Functions

This chapter documents some of the most important features in LXI Report Distribution System (LXI*rds*). If you are an experienced user, browse through this chapter to find what is new and what features have been added.

Changes in LXI*rds* are of two types: those that enhance existing features or make them easier to use, and new features that add flexibility and power to LXI*rds*.

Output Queue Distribution

LXI*rds* distributes copies of one or more reports to different output queues. Reports can be distributed on local or remote systems.

SNADS Distribution

LXI*rds* distributes copies of one or more reports to one or more recipients or locations using SNADS. Reports can be distributed on local or remote systems.

Packet Distribution

Packets are groups of reports comprised of specific portions of some reports and/or entire copies of others. Reports can be distributed on local or remote systems.

E-mail Distribution

LXI*rds* distributes copies of one or more reports to one or more recipients or locations using e-mail.

Header/Footer Page

Header pages contain the packet ID, description, address, list of all reports, and pages per report included in the packet. Header pages print at the beginning of a report and footer pages print at the end.

Separator Page

To help identify different reports or report segments, LXInls prints a user-defined number of separator pages between reports in a packet.

Ease of Use

Packets and reports may be printed, distributed and viewed online without modifications to existing software.

Menu Driven

LXI*rds* is menu driven. This provides direct, easy access to the tools that LXI*rds* supplies for creating report and packet definition and for managing the report distribution process.

Chapter 3

Overview

Report distribution is not difficult to understand. It consists of recognizing a report, determining who receives it, and then distributing it to the recipient. Automating this process, using the LXI*rds* Report Distribution System, follows those same steps: recognition, determination and distribution.

Recognition is the ability to recognize a report by its title, program name or some other code that appears within the first few lines of a report.

<u>Determination</u> is the process of using an identifying feature that appears consistently in the same place on each page of the report detail to distribute a portion of a report. Company name, department number and item numbers are examples of information used for the determination process.

<u>Distribution</u> determines who the recipient is and collects all reports or portions of reports for a specific recipient and prints them in a packet addressed to them. A <u>packet</u> is a group of reports and/or parts of reports, which are packaged together to be delivered to a specific recipient or location.

Applications send reports to a user-defined output queue where they are processed by LXI*rds*. Based on information that appears in predictable locations on the report pages, LXI*rds* distributes the reports to appropriate packets.


Report Recognition

LXIrds monitors an output queue and compares every spooled file put in it against a list of Report Definitions. Report definitions tell LXIrds how to distinguish between different reports, and there is one report definition for each unique report LXIrds is to process. If one of the first ten pages of a spooled file matches one of the report definitions, LXIrds recognizes the spooled file as a report. It will then link it with the matching report definition and prepare to distribute it. If it does not match any of the report definitions, LXIrds does nothing with it.

LXIrds allows multiple recognition items in a report definition. Internal and external recognition may be mixed for reports with the *PACKET distribution method. Only external recognition can be used for *SNADS and *OUTQ reports. When using multiple recognition items, a spooled file must match every item in order to be recognized and linked with the report definition.

Internal Recognition


Internal recognition is recognizing a spooled file based on information contained in the file. The following example illustrates an internal recognition item. The internal recognition information defines a "window" (the white rectangle) in a "template" (the gray page) that LXIrds places over the first page of every spooled file. If the text that shows through the window matches the recognition data ("Sales Report" in this example), then the spooled file matches the recognition item.



Control Break Observation Point (CBOP)

When a report is defined for *PACKET distribution, LXIrds uses a Control Break Observation Point (CBOP) to determine how to distribute each page of a report. A CBOP is similar to an internal recognition item, except that a CBOP tells LXIrds where to look - not what to look for. Later, in the packet definition, report pages are selected using logical operations on the data that show through the CBOP template. More than one CBOP can be defined for a report and each CBOP has a unique name within the report definition that LXIrds uses to refer to it.

The following example illustrates a CBOP. Notice the similarity between it and the one for report recognition. The only difference is the lack of recognition data. In the case of a CBOP, it is called **comparison data** and it is specified in the packet definition instead of the report definition. This allows each packet to choose only certain pages of the report based on the **observation data** (the data that shows through the CBOP window). If a report definition contains more than one CBOP, then the template would have one window for each CBOP.



LXI*rds* requires that every report definition using *PACKET distribution have at least one CBOP defined, whether it will be used or not. Failure to create a CBOP causes an error and the report is not distributed.

External Recognition

External recognition is recognizing a spooled file based on its attributes rather than its visible contents. The following types of external recognition are allowed:

- Form type
- Job name
- Program name
- Spooled file name
- User profile
- User data

Report Determination and Distribution

Once a report is recognized, LXIrds distributes it. If the report was defined for *OUTQ distribution, LXIrds moves the report to the output queue specified in the report definition. If the report was defined for *SNADS distribution, LXIrds sends the report to all the network addresses specified in the report definition.

The most useful type of distribution occurs with reports that are defined with the *PACKET option. LXIrds looks through the report, a page at a time, and distributes each page to all the packets that include the report and whose report selection criteria matches the observation data LXIrds sees through the CBOP "template" for that report.

Reports and parts of reports that are defined for *PACKET distribution, but are not selected by any of the selection criteria, are distributed to a default packet. The name of this default packet is *BLANK.

Chapter 4

The Monitor

The LXI*rds* monitor is the key to automating report distribution. It is important that the monitor is properly understood and operated.

When the monitor is active, it periodically scans the selected output queues for new spooled files. The time between successive scans is called the <u>monitor cycle time</u> and can be set from the RDS Configuration menu. The monitor only processes spooled files that are in RDY status. When a new spooled file is found, the monitor starts a processing job that scans the report definitions and attempts to link the spooled file with one of them.

If the spooled file is linked with a report definition that is defined for *OUTQ or *SNADS distribution, the processing job distributes the entire spooled file to the specified output queue or network address.

If the spooled file is linked with a report definition that is defined for *PACKET distribution, the processing job searches all packet definitions and distributes the report to the appropriate packets.

After the spooled file is processed, the status changes to **HLD**.

When the monitor is ended, another job, called the **SWEEPER**, starts. The sweeper waits until all spooled file processing and packet auto print jobs have ended and then shuts down the **QLXIRDS** subsystem. During this time, any attempt to start the monitor will fail.

LXI*rds* maintains two lists that aid the sweeper in waiting for jobs to end. The first lists the processing status of all spooled files. The second lists all packets that are ready to print. The sweeper ends when the entries in these lists indicate that all spooled files are processed and all auto print jobs have completed.

Starting the Monitor

The LXI*rds* monitor can be started by using **Option 9** on the Report Distribution menu or by using the Start Report Distribution Monitor (**STRRDSMON**) command. The command can be used in a job scheduler. The monitor is capable of watching one output queue or watching all output queues on the system.

Monitoring Multiple Output Queues

LXI*rds* provides the ability to have more than one monitor active at a time, allowing multiple output queues to be monitored. The steps below explain how to create multiple monitors, with each watching only one queue.

Enter the following command:

Note: "nn" refers to the number of monitors to run concurrently.

To start the monitors, use **Option 9** on the Report Distribution menu repeatedly to start monitor jobs to monitor a specific output queue. These monitors will now run concurrently and LXI*rds* will act as if all the monitored queues are combined into one queue.

<u>Note</u>: It is normal for the message "Subsystem **QLXIRDS** already active" to appear for every additional monitor started. This is actually the first line of a multi-line message, which indicates that the requested monitor is being started.

Ending the Monitor

The LXI*rds* monitor can be ended by using **Option 11** on the Report Distribution menu or by using the End Report Distribution Monitor (**EN-DRDSMON**) command. The command can be used in a job scheduler.

Note: Ending the monitor ends *all* active monitors. It can not be used to end a single monitor when multiple monitors are active.

End Monitor Considerations

The following list outlines actions that may cause sweeper job errors and must be avoided.

- 1. Do not hold spooled files once they are in a monitored output queue.
- 2. Do not delete/move spooled files from monitored output queues unless their status is **HLD**.
- 3. Do not manually end jobs running in the **QLXIRDS** subsystem.

Reprocessing a Spooled File

When a spooled file is processed, its final status entry stays in the status file until the monitor is restarted. As long as a status entry for a spooled file exists, LXI*rds* will *not* reprocess that file. To reprocess a spooled file, the following must occur.

- 1. Using **Option 10** from the Report Distribution menu prompts the Work with Report Distribution Status (**WRKRDSSTS**) command. Pressing **Enter** displays the Work with Report Distribution Status display, which lists the status of all monitored spooled files. Use **Option 4** to delete the status entry for the spooled file that needs to be reprocessed.
- 2. Release the spooled file from the output queue containing the spooled file. Once released, the monitor will reprocess it.

Chapter 5

Getting Started

In this chapter, you will learn how to implement and use the basic functions of LXIrds. If you are a new user to LXIrds, this chapter is important for two reasons: you will become comfortable navigating LXIrds, and you will have a head start on the next LXIrds program you learn.

Simplicity is the key in getting started. No special commands are required. LXI*rds* is active once the software is installed.

The purpose of this chapter is to:

- Create a Report Definition
- Create Recognition Data
- Start the RDS Monitor

The remaining chapters provide additional information on other LXI*rds* functions and options available to you.

<u>Note</u>: The following example uses output queue (*OUTQ) distribution.

Step 1.

To access the LXI Report Distribution menu, type **GO LXIRDS/LXIRDS** on any OS/400 command line.

Choose **Option 1** from the Report Distribution menu. This displays the Work with Report Definitions screen.

The Add Report Definition screen defines a report and the distribution method. Type a user-defined report code, description and type *OUTQ as the distribution method. Pressing Enter twice prompts the Change Spooled File Attributes (CHGSPLFA) command.




Step 5.

Select **Option 7** for the report definition created in Step 3. This displays the Work with Report Recognition screen where the recognition data for the report is defined.



Step 6.

Press **F6** from the Work with Report Recognition screen to display the Add Report Recognition Data screen.



Step 7.

Type *USERNAME for the recognition name and enter the user name of a spooled file to distribute. When complete, press **Enter** until the Report Distribution menu displays.

Specify the name of the output queue to monitor and press **Enter**. LXI*rds* will monitor the output queue for spooled files containing the user name specified in Step 7 and distribute those reports to the output queue defined in Step 4.

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Chapter 6

Defining Reports

The LXI*rds* implementation process consists of defining the reports to distribute. These report definitions determine the type of distribution to perform. Report distribution can be as simple as sending the spooled file to another output queue or to one or more network addresses. Complex distributions provide the ability to take a report and send selected pages to various recipients. In either case, the report definition determines what to send and where to send it.

To aid in creating a report definition, LXIrds provides the ability to create a Report Evaluation Worksheet (REW). This worksheet provides the information necessary to complete the report definition. Since all relevant information prints in the REW, the report definition process is streamlined. The REW can also make changing a report definition easier.

Defining a Report


The following steps are required when creating a report definition.

- Print a Report Evaluation Worksheet
- Create the Report Definition
- Add Report Recognition Information
- Define one or more Control Break Observation Points (CBOP)

Printing a Report Evaluation Worksheet

The Report Evaluation Worksheet (REW) simplifies the creation and management of report definitions. To print a REW for a specific report, perform the following steps:

- 1. Ensure that the LXI*rds* monitor is active. For details on starting the monitor, refer to Chapter 5, "*The Monitor*".
- 2. Move the spooled files, for the report definitions being created, to the monitored output queue. The default is **SPOUTQ** in library **LXIRDS400**.
- 3. Choose **Option 5**, from the Report Distribution menu. This prompts the Work with Report Distribution Status (**WRKRDSSTS**) command. Press **Enter**. This displays the Work with Report Distribution Status screen.




- 4. Select **Option 12** for the report to process.
- 5. Modify the "Last page to process" parameter as needed and then press Enter to print the Report Evaluation Worksheet.

Creating a Report Definition

The Work with Report Definitions (WRKRPTDFN) command lists all report definitions. To create a report definition, perform the following steps.

- 1. Select **Option 1** on the Report Distribution menu. This displays the Work with Report Definitions screen, which lists all definitions.
- 2. On the Work with Report Definitions screen, press **F6** to display the Add Report Definition screen.



Report code: Specifies a user-defined alphanumeric code for LXI*rds* to use as the name of the report definition. Report codes must begin with an alphabetic character and can not contain embedded blanks.

Report description: Specifies user-defined text that describes the contents of the report.

Distribution method: Specifies the method of distribution. The types available are *OUTQ, *SNADS and *PACKET. If *OUTQ is specified, press **F14** to enter the output queue. If *SNADS is specified, press **F14** to enter the network addresses.

Retention period: Specifies a user-defined value that determines when the report can be purged. Using the Purge Packet Data (**PRGPKTDTA**) command purges reports.

Secured Data Options

The secured data options suppress the printing of lines on a page that do not belong to the person receiving the packet. To secure data for a report definition, press **F15** on the Add Report Definition screen. This adds the following parameters (shown in bold) to the screen.

Global security flag: Specifies if the report is secured for all users. If "N" is specified, it is only secured for the packet containing the report. If "Y" is specified, it is secured for all packets.

Secured data start line: Specifies the starting line where suppression begins.

Secured data end line: Specifies the last line to suppress.

Print Extensions

The print extensions allow a user-written command or program to be executed in order to send print control information to the print file at the beginning of the report within a packet. It could be used to change paper, load a form overlay or change the **CPI** or **LPI** characteristics of a report. To add print extensions to a report definition, press **F16** from the Add Report Definition screen. This adds the following parameter to the screen.

Print extension: Specifies a user-written command or program to execute before printing the report.

Custom Distribution Program

The custom distribution program allows a user-written distribution program to handle distribution of a report to non-supported environments. The report name and spooled file information is passed to the user program. User distribution programs can be used to distribute reports to fax, optical or archive systems. After the user program completes, the report is optionally distributed by *LXIrds*. To add a custom distribution program to a report definition, press **F17** on the Add Report Definition screen. This adds the following parameter to the screen.

Custom distribution program: Specifies a user-written program to call.

Library: Specifies the library that contains the user-written program. It is recommended that the user program not reside in the LXI*rds* libraries.

Distribute report: Specifies if the report is distributed by LXI*rds* after the user written program is called.



Setting up External Recognition

The Work with Report Definitions (WRKRPTDFN) command lists all report definitions. To add external recognition data to an existing report definition, perform the following steps.

- 1. To add recognition data to a specific report definition, select **Option 7**. This displays the Work with Report Recognition screen.
- 2. Press **F6** to display the Add Recognition Data screen.



 For an external recognition item, choose one of the following predefined recognition names and fill in the recognition data. For example, if *SPLFNAME is specified, the recognition data is the name of the spooled file.

*FORMTYPE - recognized by the form type associated with it.

*JOBNAME - recognized by the job that created it.

*PGMNAME - recognized by the program name that opened the file.

*SPLFNAME - recognized by its name.

*USERDATA - recognized by the user data associated with it.

*USERNAME - recognized by the name of the user who created it.

4. Repeat steps 2 and 3 for each external recognition item required.


Note: Quotes should not be included unless they are part of the data.

Note: Recognition data is case sensitive.

Setting up Internal Recognition

The Work with Report Definitions (WRKRPTDFN) command lists all report definitions. To add internal recognition data to an existing report definition, perform the following steps.

- 1. To add recognition data to a specific report definition, select **Option 7**. This displays the Work with Report Recognition screen.
- 2. Press **F6** to display the Add Recognition Data screen.



3. For an internal recognition item, choose an arbitrary recognition name and fill in the **starting** and **ending lines**, **starting column**, **length of recognition data** and **recognition data** fields. Recognition data is specific text at a specific location on a report. The recognition data must be found within the first 10 pages of the report.

To simplify the setup, use the output from the Print Report Evaluation (PRTRPTEVAL) command.

The starting and ending lines, along with the starting column and length of recognition data, define a rectangular area called a **recognition point**.

Data starting line: Specifies the line on which the recognition data starts.

Data ending line: Specifies the line on which the recognition data ends.

Length of recognition data: Specifies the length of the data to be recognized.

Scan field: Specifies if LXI*rds* should scan the data in the recognition point. If "**Y**" is specified, the recognition point is scanned for any occurrence of the recognition data. If "**N**" is specified, the recognition data must match the data in the recognition point in its entirety. Set this parameter value to "**N**" if the length of recognition data is specified.

Use wildcard: Specifies if wildcards are allowed. If "**Y**" is specified, the "*" can be used in the recognition data as a wildcard. If "**N**" is specified, the "*" is treated as part of the recognition data.

4. Repeat steps 2 and 3 for each internal recognition item required.

Note: Quotes should not be included unless they are part of the data.


Note: Recognition data is case sensitive.

Setting up Control Break Observation Points (CBOP)

A Control Break Observation Point (**CBOP**) is required if the report definition is defined for ***PACKET** distribution. LXI*rds* requires at least one CBOP for every report. Failure to define one will create a ***RPTERR** status during the distribution process. A CBOP is not allowed for ***OUTQ** or ***SNADS** distribution.

To setup a CBOP, perform the following steps.

- 1. On the Work with Report Definitions screen, select **Option 8** for the report definition to change. Pressing **Enter** will display the Work with Control Break Observation Points screen.
- 2. Press **F6** to display the Add Control Break Observation Point screen.



3. Enter the **beginning** and **ending lines to observe**, **column to observe** and **length of observation data** fields. Observation data is specific text at a specific location on a report.

Break type: Specifies how CBOP processing occurs. If *ALLDATA is specified, the CBOP value is analyzed for inclusion in a packet. If *NONBLANK is specified, the CBOP value persists to subsequent pages, providing that the observed location is blank. When non-blank data is encountered, the previous CBOP value is replaced with the current data and analyzed for inclusion in a packet. This is referred to as a "sticky CBOP".

Beginning line to observe: Specifies the beginning location of the observation point on the report page.

Ending line to observe: Specifies the ending location of the observation point on the report page.

Column to observe: Specifies the report column that contains the observation point on the report page.

Length of observation data: Specifies the length of the data to observe.

4. Repeat step 2 for each CBOP required.


Note: There are two performance considerations related to CBOPs. A single CBOP can span multiple lines. Since LXI*rds* must scan each included line on each page, multiple-line CBOPs have an impact on performance. Defining a large number of CBOPs for a report will also affect performance. It is best to use a minimal number of single-line CBOPs for optimal performance.

Collation Key Definitions

LXI*rds* provides the ability to sort packet defined reports based on a user-defined key. The key could be a name or account number that prints in the same location on a report. If multiple reports, within a packet, contain an account number and the account number is defined as the key for the reports, the reports can be sorted by the account number before they print. This ensures that all reports pertaining to the same account number print together.

To access the collation key definition, select **Option 11** from the Work with Report Definition screen for the report that will use a collation key. This displays the Define Collation Key window.

Collation key definitions are only valid for *PACKET distributions.




Key Line: Specifies the line number that contains the key.

Key Column: Specifies the column number where the key starts.

Key Length: Specifies the length of the key.

Report Distribution Status

To view the status of the distribution monitor and the spooled file processing jobs, use the Work with Report Distribution Status (WRKRDSSTS) command or Option 10 on the Report Distribution menu.



The status codes and their meanings are as follows:

*ACTIVE	The processing job for the listed spooled file is currently running. If the report code field contains *NONE, the processing job is attempting to recognize the report. If the report code field contains a valid report code, the processing job has successfully identified the report, linked it with a report definition and is distributing the report according to its definition.
*CUSTDST	LXIrds has recognized the report and is running a custom dis-

tribution program.

*DELETED The distribution entry has been deleted.

LXIrds has already processed a report that matches this report *DUPLICATE description. Attempts to process a duplicate report are re-

jected.

A processor job has been submitted for the listed spooled file. *JOBQ

The job is waiting in the queue.

No report definitions match the listed spooled file. *NOTRECOG

*OUTQ A report has been distributed using the *OUTQ distribution

method. The process has completed.

*PRCERR An error occurred with the processing job. For some reason it

is unable to process the spooled file. This happens if the spooled file contains graphic data or is an IPDS or AFP stream.

*PURGED	Packet data associated with the report has been purged. See the Purge Packet Data (PRGPKTDTA) for additional information.
*READY	The processing job successfully recognized and distributed the listed spooled file.

*RPTERR The processor tried to distribute a report. This occurs if a CBOP is not defined for a *PACKET report.

*SNADS A report has been distributed using the *SNADS distribution method. The process has completed.

If an error occurs, a message is sent to the **QSYSOPR** message queue detailing the failure.

Chapter 7

Defining Packets

If any reports are defined for *PACKET distribution, then defining packets is the last step in setting up LXIrds. This step is only required when distributing *PACKET reports. Packet definitions tell LXIrds how to distribute the *PACKET reports. Physically, a packet is a bundle of reports and parts of reports that are to be delivered to a specific person or location. The packet has a header page, which contains the name of the packet, the name of the addressee and the delivery location. Also on the header is a list of all the reports included in the packet and the number of pages from each report.

Reports and parts of reports that are defined for *PACKET distribution, but are not selected by any of the selection criteria, are distributed to a default packet. The name of the default packet is *BLANK.

LXIrds *PACKET distribution works on all spooled files except those with *IPDS (Intelligent Printer Data Stream) or *AFPDS (Advanced Function Printing Data Stream) attributes. Due to the nature of these types of spooled files, LXIrds can not format them into recognizable data elements for *PACKET distribution. A processing error (*PRCERR) occurs if *IPDS or *AFPDS data streams are used for *PACKET distribution.

This chapter will discuss:

- Report Selection
- Logic Groups
- How to Define Packets

Report Selection

LXI*rds* uses report selection criteria to determine which parts of the report to include in the packet. A packet report may have more than one element of selection criteria. Each element of selection criteria for a packet consists of the name of a CBOP defined for that report, a **comparison operator** and **comparison data**. For each page of that report, LXI*rds* uses the comparison operator to compare the comparison data to the **observation data**. If the observation data compares to the comparison data according to the comparison operator, the selection criteria is considered to be true. If <u>all</u> of the selection criteria are true for a given page, the page is included in the packet. Otherwise, it is placed in the default packet *BLANK.

Selection criteria and Control Break Observation Points may be paired in the following ways:

- Multiple selection criteria may reference the same CBOP. At least one element of criteria must be true for the page to be selected.
- Each selection criteria statement may refer to a different CBOP. At least one element of criteria per CBOP must be true for the page to be selected.
- Some combination of the above.

Example 1:

If three criteria statements refer to the same CBOP, page selection would occur as follows:

```
If criteria-1 = true
OR criteria-2 = true
OR criteria-3 = true
THEN include the page
```

Example 2:

If three criteria statements refer to CBOP-A and two criteria statements refer to CBOP-B, page selection would occur as follows:

```
If CBOP-A criteria-1 = true
OR CBOP-A criteria-2 = true
OR CBOP-A criteria-3 = true
AND
    If CBOP-B criteria-1 = true
    OR CBOP-B criteria-2 = true
    THEN include the page
```

The result of multiple tests from the same CBOP are logically 'OR'ed, and the result of tests from different CBOPs are logically 'AND'ed together. If the result is true, the page is included in the packet.

Logic Groups

Sometimes it is necessary to have several independent groups of report selection criteria for a certain packet report. Report selection criteria for a packet report may be divided into logic groups, which are distinguished by their logic group names. LXIrds treats each logic group independently of other logic groups. Within each logic group, criteria processes according to the rules previously defined in Report Selection. Then, the results from all logic groups are OR'ed, and the page is included if the result of that OR is true.

The following example illustrates logic group processing.

Example 1:

Logic Group One contains three criteria statements that refer to the same CBOP.

```
If criteria-1 = true
    OR criteria-2 = true
    OR criteria-3 = true
```

Logic Group Two contains three criteria statements that refer to CBOP-A and two criteria statements that refer to CBOP-B.

```
If CBOP-A criteria-1 = true
OR CBOP-A criteria-2 = true
OR CBOP-A criteria-3 = true
AND
    If CBOP-B criteria-1 = true
    OR CBOP-B criteria-2 = true
```

If either logic group is true, the page is included in the packet.

```
If Logic Group One = true
  OR Logic Group Two = true
  THEN include the page
```

Defining a Packet


The following steps are required when defining packets.

- Create the Packet Definition
- Add Reports to the Packet

Creating a Packet Definition

To create a packet definition, perform the following steps:

- Select Option 2 on the Report Distribution menu. This displays the Work with Packet Definitions (WRKPKTDFN) screen, which lists all definitions.
- 2. Pressing **F6** displays the Add Packet Definition screen. Fill in the fields as required.



Packet ID: Specifies a user-defined alphanumeric identifier that LXI*rds* uses as the name of the packet definition. Packet identifiers must begin with an alphabetic character and can not contain embedded blanks.

Packet description: Specifies user-defined text that describes the packet. The description prints on the packet header.

Packet address: Specifies the address to which the final printed packet should be delivered. The address prints on the packet header.

E-mail address: Specifies the address to which the final printed packet should be e-mailed. The address prints on the packet header. For information on setting up e-mail on the AS/400, refer to the appropriate IBM AS/400 Electronic-Mail Capabilities documentation.

Print/E-mail option: Specifies when and under what conditions the packet is printed or e-mailed. The available options are:

*AUTO — Automatically print the completed packet.

*AUTOEMAIL — Automatically e-mail the completed packet.

*EMAIL – E-mail on demand. *HOLD – Do not print the packet.

*NOPRT — Do not print incomplete packet.

*PRINT — Print on demand.

*PRTMSG — Print with incomplete message.

Print sequence: Specifies the number used to determine the printing sequence. Packets with lower numbers print before packets with higher numbers.

Header/Footer pages: Specifies the number of header and footer pages to generate. Header pages contain the packet ID, description, address and a list of all reports, and pages per report, included in the packet. Header pages print at the beginning of a report and footer pages print at the end.

Separator pages: Specifies the number of separator pages to insert between reports in the packet.

Enhanced duplex print: Specifies that all reports in a packet start on the front side of a page. This option requires the use of printers capable of duplex printing.

Packet collation: Specifies if reports are collated based on a collation key definition. Collation keys are defined in the report definition. For additional information on collation keys, refer to *Collation Key Definitions* in Chapter 6.


Print extensions: Specifies a user-written command or program to execute, which sends print control information to the print file at the beginning of a packet. This could be used to change paper, load a form overlay or change the **LPI** or **CPI** characteristics of the reports within the packet.

Packet print attributes: Specifies the overrides, if any, being used for this packet. Overrides are applied by using the **F14** key to prompt the packet print attributes.

Adding Reports to a Packet

To add reports to a packet definition, perform the following steps:

- 1. Select **Option 9** on the Work with Packet Definitions (**WRKPKTDFN**) screen. This displays the Work with Packet Reports screen, which lists reports associated with the packet.
- 2. Pressing **F6** displays the Add Report to Packet screen. Fill in the fields as required.



Report code: Specifies the report code of the report to add to the packet. Pressing **F4** displays existing report codes of type *PACKET.

Packet delivery schedule: Specifies which days to include the report in the packet. When a report is processed, it is marked with the current day and then distributed to packets defined to receive this report on that day. The day used is the day the report is processed by LXI*rds* – not the day that the report was produced.


Number of copies: Specifies the number of copies of the report to include in the packet.

Print sequence: Specifies the number used to determine the printing sequence. Reports with lower numbers print before reports with higher numbers.

Secured report: Specifies if the LXI*rds* Report Security feature will suppress the printing of lines of a page that do not belong to the person receiving the packet.

Print extensions: Specifies a user-written command or program to execute, which sends print control information to the print file at the beginning of a report within a packet. This could be used to change paper, load a form overlay or change the **LPI** or **CPI** characteristics of a report.

3. Pressing **Enter** displays the Add Report Selection Criteria screen. Fill in the fields as required.



Logic group: Specifies the logic group associated with the selection criteria. Pressing **F4** provides the ability to select existing logic group codes or create new codes. This is an optional field.

Observation point name: Specifies the observation point to observe. The observation point (CBOP) must exist on the report referenced by the report code. Pressing F4 displays existing observation points.

Comparison operator: Specifies how to compare between the observation point data and the comparison data. Pressing **F4** displays valid operators.


Comparison data: Specifies one or more values to compare with the observation data on each report page, using the comparison operator, in order to determine whether this criteria is true. Since this field may contain multiple values, separated by a blank, each value *must* be enclosed in single quotes.

- 4. To add additional selection criteria, select **Option 7** from the Work with Packet Reports screen. This displays the Work with Report Selection Criteria screen. Press **F6** to display the Add Report Selection Criteria screen.
- 5. To add additional reports to the packet, repeat steps 2 and 3.


Adding a Custom Schedule Program

LXI*rds* provides the ability to add custom scheduling programs. These user-created programs are used to determine when a distribution occurs. This interface is used if the scheduling options within LXI*rds* do not provide enough functionality.

To access the custom scheduling interface, position the cursor on the Schedule name field and press **F4**. This displays the Select Custom Schedule screen where custom schedules are displayed. If the desired custom schedule exists, choose **Option 1** to select it. To work with existing schedules or to add a new schedule, press **F10**. This displays the Work with Custom Schedule Table screen.



The Work with Custom Schedules Table lists existing schedules. To delete an existing schedule, choose **Option 4**. To add a new schedule, press **F9**. This displays the second screen of the Work with Custom Schedules Table where the name of the custom schedule and associated program and library are defined. It is recommended that the user program not reside in the LXI*rds* libraries. Enter a user-defined schedule name, description, program name and library.





Adding Logic Groups to a Packet

Logic groups provide the ability to logically group CBOP tests together. For additional information, see *Logic Groups* earlier in this Chapter. To add logic groups to a packet definition, perform the following steps:


- 1. Position the cursor on the Logic group field on the Add Report Selection Criteria screen and press **F4**. This displays the Select Logic Group screen.
- 2. Pressing **F6** from the Select Logic Group displays the Add Logic Group Code screen. Type a user-defined logic group code and description. Press **Enter** when complete.



Adding Custom Operator Processing Programs

Custom operator processing programs provide the ability to create userdefined custom comparison operators to handle very special and complex cases. These cases might include empirically derived information to which there is no reference on the report page. These cases might also require analysis of additional data.

To add custom operator processing programs, position the cursor on the Comparison operator field and press **F4**. This displays the Select Comparison Operator window. Use Option 1 to select an existing comparison operator or press **F10** to edit the comparison operator table.



The comparison operator table lists existing operators and provides the means of specifying user-created custom operator processing programs. To delete an existing comparison operator, select **Option 4**. To add a new comparison operator along with the user operator processing program and validation program, press **F9**. This displays the second screen of the Edit Comparison Operator where the name of the custom comparison operators and associated program and library are defined. It is recommended that the user program not reside in the LXI*rds* libraries. Enter the name of a user defined comparison operator, description, program name and library.

Packets and SNADS

When a report is defined for *SNADS distribution, the whole report is sent over the network. To send a packet over the network, define a packet as outlined in this Chapter, with the following exceptions:

- 1. On the Add Packet Definition screen, press **F14**. This prompts the Override with Printer File (**OVRPRTF**) command. Press **F10** and page down to the User data parameter. Set the User data (**USRDTA**) parameter to the name of the packet and the Output queue (**OUTQ**) parameter to **SPOUTQ**.
- 2. On the Add Packet Definition screen, change the print option to *AUTO.
- 3. Define a new report that uses external recognition to recognize the packet spooled file created in step 1. The recognition data should be the packet name (defined as the user data). Define this report for *SNADS distribution.

Now the packet will be created automatically, then recognized as a *SNADS report and distributed over the network.

Chapter 8

Configuration Options

LXIrds provides the ability to customize specific features. This provides the user with the ability to change or enhance product functions based on the environment or user requirements.


Configuration Options

LXIrds provides the ability to customize the following:

- Packet Definition Print Attributes
- Report Evaluation Worksheet Print Attributes


The Configuration Menu

The RDS Configuration menu provides the options necessary to modify the attributes of the product. To access the RDS Configuration menu, select **Option 40** from the Report Distribution menu. To change a product attribute, select the appropriate option and press **Enter**.



Header Character Generator

The header character generator creates or changes letters, numbers and special characters used on the packet header page. To view and optionally change the characters, select **Option 1** from the RDS Configuration menu. This displays the Design Packet Header Character Set screen.



To view and optionally change characters, use the **Page Up/Page Down** keys or enter the character in the Character field and press **F4**. To add a character, specify it in the Character field and design it in the fields provided. When complete, press **Enter**.

Distribution Monitor Job Name

To change the name of the distribution monitor, select **Option 2** from the RDS Configuration menu. This prompts the Change Monitor Job Name (**CHGMONJBNM**) command. The default is **RD_MONITOR**. The name can be changed to another value or *OUTQ which will give the monitor the same name as the output queue being monitored.

Monitor Cycle Time

The monitor cycle time determines how often the monitor will check the output queue for new spooled files. To change how often the monitor searches for new spooled files to process, select **Option 3** from the RDS Configuration menu. This prompts the Change Monitor Cycle (**CHGMON-CYC**) command. Specify a time, in seconds, and press **Enter**.


CBOP Translation Table

CBOP translation provides the ability to:

- Translate many values into fewer values, such as translating the names of cities into regions.
- Provide custom translation through user-written programs. The userwritten program determines the translated value and returns it back to LXIrds.

To view and optionally change the CBOP translation table, perform the following;

- 1. Select **Option 4** from the RDS Configuration menu. This displays the Work with Translation Group Codes screen. To create a translation table, press **F6**. This displays the Add Translation Group Code window.
- 2. Enter the user-defined translation group code and description. To automatically add new values encountered during CBOP processing to the table, specify "Y" in the Auto add values field. To specify a user written program to perform translations, press F14. It is recommended that the user program not reside in the LXIrds libraries. Press Enter when complete.



3. To add table entries, select **Option 5** for a translation group code. This displays the Edit Translation Group screen. To add values to the translation table, press **F9**. This displays the Edit Translation Group screen. Press **Enter** when complete.

Note: Table entries are not allowed if a user-written translation program is being used.



From value: Specifies the value being translated.

Auto Print

To change the auto print capability, select **Option 5** from the RDS Configuration menu. This prompts the Change Auto Print Status (**CHGAPSTS**) command. The default is *YES.

Default Packet Print Attributes

To change the printer file attributes for distributed packets, select **Option 6** from the RDS Configuration menu. This prompts the Change Printer File (**CHGPRTF**) command.

Report Definition Print Attributes

To change the printer file attributes for the report definition, select **Option 7** from the RDS Configuration menu. This prompts the Change Printer File (**CHGPRTF**) command.

Packet Definition Print Attributes

To change the printer file attributes for the packet definition, select **Option 8** from the RDS Configuration menu. This prompts the Change Printer File (**CHGPRTF**) command.

Report Evaluation Worksheet Print Attributes

To change the printer file attributes for the report evaluation worksheet, select **Option 9** from the RDS Configuration menu. This prompts the Change Printer File (**CHGPRTF**) command.

Coordinated Print Feature

To change the coordinated print feature, select **Option 10** from the RDS Configuration menu. This prompts the Change Coordinated Print Status (**CHGCPSTS**) command.

Processing Date Option

To change the processing date option, select **Option 11** from the RDS Configuration menu. This prompts the Set Process Date (**SETPRCDTE**) command. The options available are:

*START - The date the monitor was started (default).

*PROCESS - The date the spooled file was processed.

*SPLF - The date the spooled file was created.

Blank Packet Print Control

The *BLANK packet print status determines if the default packet should be printed along with other packets. To change the *BLANK packet print control, select **Option 13** from the RDS Configuration menu. This prompts the Change *BLANK Packet Print Status (CHGBPPSTS) command. The default is *YES.

Printing Reports

To print a report, choose the associated command and press **F4**. This prompts the command for required selection criteria. Specify *PRINT for the **OUTPUT** parameter to spool the output to the job's output queue or to the output queue specified in the printer file, if overridden.

Changing Printer File Attributes

Changing the printer file provides the ability to change the attributes of the printer device file. The attributes that can be changed include the device, device type, lines per page, lines per inch, characters per inch and output queue. The ability to change the LXI*rds* printer file is based on the user's authority to the IBM Change Printer File (CHGPRTF) command.

To change the printer file attributes for a specific report, select the appropriate option from the RDS Configuration menu.

Packet Definition Listing

The Display Packet Definition (DSPPKTDFN) command, which is used to list all or specific packet definitions, creates the Packet Definition Listing.

Chapter 10

Commands

LXIrds is a command-driven product. Even in the LXIrds menus, commands are executed to perform the requested function. If desired, these commands can be used directly, instead of the menus, to provide faster access to LXIrds functions. Not all commands can be used in the same environment. Some commands can only be used interactively (I), some only in batch (B) and others are available for all environments (B/I). Commands are restricted to the environment for which they were created. Before using a LXIrds command, ensure that it is allowed in the environment from which you wish to execute it.

The following pages show all of the Report Distribution System commands with their parameters and a brief description of each parameter's purpose.

The commands are listed in alphabetical sequence.

CHGAPSTS - Change Auto Print Status

Change Auto Print Status (CHGAPSTS) Environment: B/I

Auto print capability active . . . <u>*YES</u> *YES, *NO

Purpose

The Create Alternate Environment (CRTALTENV) command creates an alternate environment for RDS. Its purpose is for creating multiple instances of RDS such that the processing time can be tracked independently. An example would be a service bureau or a large company performing distribution for its divisions.

Note: It is strongly recommended that the benefits and drawbacks are weighed before using multiple environments. A user could easily change report and packet definitions for the wrong environment if not careful. The menu names play an essential role in indicating the current alternate environment being worked with.

Each environment has its own data library, which provides easier management of report and packet definitions as well as CPU resources during the distribution processes. No changes are made to objects contained in the LXIRDS program library. When an alternate environment is used, two libraries are used – LXIRDS and the alternate environment file library. No objects from the LXIRDS400 file library are used. It is imperative that the library list be set correctly to prevent using the files from the wrong file library. The library list is set automatically when the appropriate alternate environment RDS main menu is used.

For additional considerations and recommendations, read the online help text for this command.

The End RDS Monitor (ENDRDSMON) command ends all distribution monitoring. This command optionally ends the RDS subsystem and should be the only method used for ending the subsystem. Product control flags are set and cleanup processes are performed prior to ending the subsystem to ensure proper operation. If the subsystem is ended outside of the product, unpredictable results may occur. The product may become unsynchronized such that the distribution monitor may refuse to stay active after being started.

When this command is used, several things occur. The monitor job ends within a short time and another job, called a sweeper, starts. The sweeper waits until all spooled file processing jobs and packet auto print jobs complete, and then shuts down the subsystem. During this time, requests to start the monitor will fail.

LXInth maintains two lists that aid the sweeper in waiting for jobs to end. The first lists the processing status of all spooled files. The second lists all packets that are ready to print. The sweeper ends when the entries in these lists indicate that all spooled files are processed and all auto print jobs have completed.

The following list outlines actions that may cause sweeper job errors and must be avoided.

- Do not hold spooled files once they are in a monitored output queue.
- Do not delete/move spooled files from monitored output queues unless their status is HLD.
- Do not manually end jobs running in the QLXIRDS subsystem.
- Do not end the QLXIRDS subsystem while the SWEEPER job is running.

Parameters

PRINT: Specifies if packets are printed.

***YES** Packets are printed based on the print options.

*NO Packets are not printed.

ENDSBS: Specifies if the subsystem ends after the sweeper job completes.

*YES The subsystem ends after all processing and print jobs

Chapter 11

Install/Uninstall Instructions

This chapter describes the install/uninstall processes. The installation of the Report Distribution System is easy and only takes a few minutes to load and setup. Please read and follow these instructions carefully to avoid problems and assure trouble free product performance.

Install Process

The installation process loads/updates the product from CD to disk. To install, follow the instructions in the *Readme* text file provided on the CD. These instructions guide you through the installation process. If this is a first-time install, the installation process creates the following libraries on the system.

LXI Base and Support Programs

LXIRDS Report Distribution System Programs

LXIRDS400 Report Distribution System Files

Upgrading OS/400

When upgrading from one OS/400 release to another, call LXI Corp. for upgrade instructions.

Changing the iSeries

Moving this product from one iSeries to another or upgrading to a different iSeries model requires a new license key. Once the product moves to the new iSeries or the iSeries is upgraded to a different model, call LXI Corp. for a new license key. No install is required.

Uninstall Process

To remove LXIrds from the system, perform the following:

Verify that SPOUTQ is empty.

End the RDS monitor.

DLTLICPGM LICPGM(0LX0000) OPTION(86)

Entering the License Key

The Report Distribution System (LXIrds) requires a valid license key in order to function. The license key is based on the serial number and model of the iSeries. To enter a license key, perform the following:

Step 1.	GO LXI/LXI
Step 2.	Tab to the SETUP option on the menu bar.
Step 3.	Press Enter to view the options available.
Step 4.	Select "Work with License Info.".
Step 5.	Select Option 1 from feature 8600.
Step 6.	Enter the supplied license key.

Trial Period

The trial period is valid for a period of 30 days from the time the product is *first* used. In order for LXI*rds* to continue performing report distributions after the 30-day trial period, a license key must be entered.

Permanent License Key

Once the software has been purchased and payment received by LXI Corp., a *permanent license key* will be issued. This permanent license key must be entered into the software to ensure that the product continues without interruption.

The license key remains valid unless the iSeries serial or model number changes. When a change occurs, you should notify LXI Corp. to get another license key.

Chapter 12

Troubleshooting Guide

The purpose of this guide is to list commonly asked questions regarding the use of the Report Distribution System. Each question and answer is designed to resolve specific situations as quickly as possible. This guide should be the first place a user looks when encountering any type of function that does not appear to operate as expected. If, after reviewing this guide, a question still exists, contact LXI Product Support for assistance.

1. I entered the license key and LXI*rds* says it is invalid.

The license key is date sensitive. If the evaluation time has elapsed, another license key is required. If you are entering a permanent license key, make sure that you entered the license key correctly. Additional information can be found in Chapter 11 – *Install/Uninstall Instructions*. If the code still does not work, call LXI Product Support.

2. I defined external report recognition but the report keeps being processed as *NORECOG.

Verify that you did not use single quotes when identifying the recognition data.

3. Reports are not being distributed to defined packets.

Verify that the reports have been added to the packet and that at least one valid CBOP has been defined.

4. The monitor does not process a report.

Verify that the report has not processed. If it has, use **Option 4** on the Work with RDS Status screen. Verify that the report is in the monitored output queue. Verify that the report is in **RDY** status.

Electronic Software Support (ESS) is a module within all LXI Corp. products that provides LXI Technical Support staff access to your system, upon your approval, to help isolate and resolve issues. This process helps ensure that your product is working correctly and performing to design standards.

Online support allows an LXI product technician to sign on to your system for diagnostic purposes. This method is beneficial when issues cannot be resolved easily. Online support requires that you provide LXI with a user profile, password and virtual device for system access.

Setting up ESS

Before using ESS, some initial setup must be performed. This setup includes defining any special characters or numbers that must be dialed prior to dialing the LXI Corp. Product Support number, determining the modem type and optionally defining the resource name and line speed. This setup only needs to be performed once or if the information changes.

To access the ESS main menu, type GO LXI/ESS on an OS/400 command line and press Enter.

Updating the Configuration Data

Select **Option 1** from the Setup pull-down menu. This displays the Configuration Data panel. This panel specifies the LXI Product Support phone number and the modem type parameter.


Do not alter the LXI Corp. phone number unless you need to add special characters in front of it for time delay or outside line purposes.

If an **external** modem is specified in the modem type parameter, press **Enter**. This displays two additional parameters which are the resource number of the line being used and the speed of the modem. Review and optionally change the information and press **Enter**.

If an **internal** modem is specified, press **Enter**.

Requesting Online Support

To start online support, enter **Option 1** from the Electronic Software Support menu. This displays the Customer Information panel. Enter the required information and press **Enter**. To start the **ESS** online support process, press **F6**.



ESS Considerations

When using an external modem, **ESS** leaves the line varied on. Due to processing restrictions, **ESS** cannot vary the line off.
